

## **2019 Mineral County Emergency Services Training Weekend Description of Classes**

### **FRIDAY, SATURDAY, SUNDAY CLASSES**

#### **Class 101      Rope Rescue, Level 1 NFPA 1006, Ch. 6, 2013 ed.**

20 hours, Friday 6-10pm, Saturday and Sunday 8 am to 5 pm

Open to Junior Firefighters: Yes

Prerequisites: Rescue Core Prerequisites, NFPA 1006 Chapter 5, OR WVU-FSE Rescue Core Course, OR Rope Rescue Low Angle Operations. Participants must provide verification of prerequisite training to receive certification.

Class Description: Topics include size up and hazards of rope rescue environments; moving victims with a rope rescue system, knots, bends, hitches, anchors, mechanical advantage systems, lowering systems, belay systems, High Angle rope operations. A strong emphasis is placed on safety. Participants should provide Gloves, Helmet, Safety Glasses, and Boots. Books are available for use in class at no charge or can be purchased from WVPST for \$80

#### **Class 102      NIMS / ICS 300**
