Office 365 Suite for Instructors

Critical Thinking for Educational Success

Critical Thinking involves the ability to reflect on an idea or problem, apply reason, and make logical connections between ideas. It is about being an active learner rather than a passive recipient of information. For close to 50 years, educators and politicians from classrooms to the Oval Office have stressed the importance of graduating students who are skilled critical thinkers. Content that once had to be drilled into students' heads is now just a phone swipe away, but the ability to make sense of that information requires thinking critically about it. Similarly, our democracy today is imperiled not by lack of access to data and opinions about the most important issues of the day, but rather by our inability to sort the true from the fake (or hopelessly biased). We will explore ways to incorporate critical thinking into your classroom thus producing students with a true understanding of the material.

Understanding the WV EMS and NREMT Certification Process

Understanding Live Fire Training Requirements and NFPA 1403

This dynamic program will introduce the attendees to the updated 2018 NFPA 1403 Live Fire Standard and the requirements of the 2019 NFPA 1041 standard. These standards have had many changes from the last editions. Topics include minimum training requirements, new safety officer responsibilities, updated instructor qualifications and new sections covering mobile enclosed fire training props. Performance Under Pressure: Building a Reality Based Training Program

Sports Psychology is being used in professional sports and the United States Olympic teams. How does Sports Psychology relate to the fire service? Firefighters are tactical athletes who need tools to accomplish high speed problem solving under pressure. This open and honest lecture provides the attendees information on how their bodies and minds react when the fear response is activated, how to harness this response and accomplish "flow". Using our Reality Based Training model with sports psychology, attendees will walk away with a roadmap on how to train and the ability to perform under pressure.

Implementing Study Guides for Student Success

This class is a review of the Fire Fighter 1 and Hazardous Materials Study Guides. It was originally designed as a remediation for a group of students that failed their exams for either FF1 and/or Haz Mat Ops. All of the students that attended the review session passed their exams on their next attempt. We also used this for a student that needed remediation to take a fourth attempt on an exam. This student also passed on his fourth attempt at the exam. My delivery time for this review was 4 hours. This review process is designed to be utilized by instructors to prepare their students for their exams. The goal of this review is to improve the pass rate for FF1 and Haz Mat Ops exams.

Cline served on the FEMA grant criteria development committee, Congressional Fire Service Institute (CFSI) National Advisory Committee, FDIC Advisory Board and peer reviewer for the Fire Act Grants.

Cline was honored in 2000 with the prestigious International Society of Fire Service Instructors (ISFSI), George D. Post International Instructor of the Year. He holds a Bachelors Degree in Social Services with a Minor in Education from Concord University.

Cline is a well-known international speaker presenting dynamic power packed/high intensity programs on leadership, officer development, instructor development, rapid intervention team training and firefighter safety and survival. Cline also is a highly published author.

Cline further hosts "Fire and Training" blog talk radio show on Fire Engineering and "The Chief's trumpet", the Official pod cast for the Southeast Association of Fire Chiefs.
